Medicare Part A (Hospital Insurance) covers inpatient, non-religious, non-medical care when these conditions are met:

1. The RNHCI is currently certified to participate in Medicare. (See Facility Medicare # in Section B)
2. The RNHCI Utilization Review Committee (URC) will determine if this patient will require hospital level of care if they weren't in the RNHCI. (See Acute Level of Care Criteria in Section E)
3. A written election stating that the need for RNHCI care will be based on both eligibility and religious beliefs. The election must also state that if the patient decides to accept standard medical care, the RNHCI election will be cancelled and the patient may have to wait 1–5 years to be eligible for a new election to get RNHCI services.
